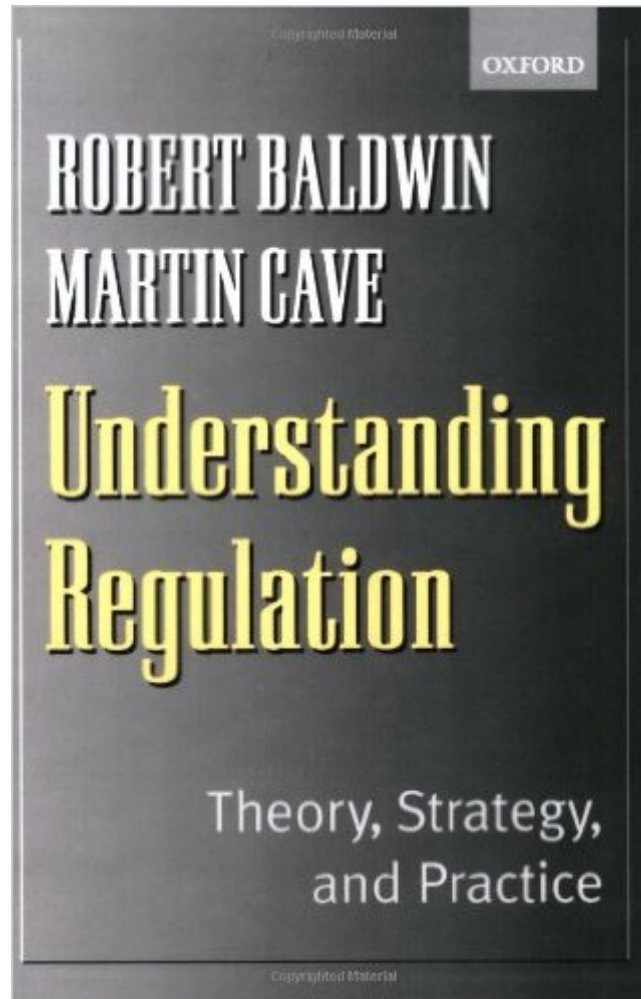

If someone prefers simple, American narration of short and plain sentences, he or she might feel overwhelmed by the authors' style. One star I took away because of uneven distribution of theory and practice among the chapters. I regretted the fact that the chapter 'Regulation and Development', which was the most interesting to me, lacked that practical approach of the chapter 'Network Issues'. Generally, I would recommend this book to anyone who really cares what does 'good regulation' actually mean - provided that this person has plenty of time to read.
